## **San Joaquin County Sheriff Steve Moore Endorses Brad Goehring in 11<sup>th</sup> Congressional District**

*Popular Sheriff Moore's endorsement tops off surge of support for Goehring as GOP

**Stockton (CA)** –San Joaquin County Sheriff Steve Moore today endorsed grape grower Brad Goehring for the 11<sup>th</sup> congressional district. Moore's endorsement comes on the heels of last week's surge of support which included Assemblyman Bill Berryhill and Manteca Mayor Willie Weatherford.

“The 11th Congressional district needs a congressman who knows the district, has lived in our district, and understands the needs of our district. From law enforcement to the concerns of the hard-working families who live here, Brad Goehring is the best candidate to represent our area. I am proud to endorse Brad Goehring as the Republican candidate for Congress in the 11th Congressional district,” said Moore.

Brad and his wife Kristin were married in 1997 and they have three children, Lexus, Bryson, and Brielle. They make their home in Clements in northern San Joaquin County.

Brad currently serves on the Board of the Lodi Woodbridge Winegrape Commission and the California Association of Winegrape Growers. Recognized statewide as a leader on agricultural issues, Brad serves as Director at Large for the San Joaquin County Farm Bureau and as national spokesman for the California Farm Bureau's work on the Clean Water Act.
